Good morning,

I have attached a map showing the locations for shelters in Clay County. As you can see, the shelters are all located at schools. There are none listed as being designated specifically for offenders/predators. Clay County Emergency Management is the agency that deals with the shelters and since they are located at schools, Clay County School Police is the agency that handles the security for them. Questions 1 through 4 of your letter should be answered by those agencies. The attached map is listed on the county website (www.claycountygov.com) under Emergency Management. Their contact information can also be found there.

In reference to questions 5 and 6, it would depend on what emergency orders have been issued for each storm as to whether the registration office is open during an event. If all offices have been closed, then no the registration office would not be opened during the hurricane or natural disaster. If the office is closed during the event, then the registrant can report the temporary address after the event is over and the office is opened back up. They can always contact the Clay County Sheriff's Office for more information.
