**Subject:** [EXTERNAL] Requirements for Visiting Persons

Good afternoon, Gail,

- 1) Offenders must register with the local police department in the city or town they will reside or visit within 24 hours of arrival.
- 2) Registrants are not posted to our public website unless they have been designated a level 2 or 3 offender by the RI Sex Offender Board of Review.
- 3) A registrant will be removed from our registry if a) the person's duty to register has expired, b) the person is deceased, or c) the person has registered in another jurisdiction AND has no registrable offenses in RI.
- 4) Any registering sex offender is not to live within 300 feet of a school. The registering local police department can help an offender determine if a residence is acceptable.
- 5) In RI, registration is required for 10 years from the end of sentence EXCEPT if the offender has been convicted of an aggravated offense, is a recidivist, or has been determined a sexually violent predator in RI, then the person is required to register for their lifetime. RISOBOR designates a risk level, not tier based, and registration duration is unrelated.

- 7) A driver's license and/or state ID card
- 8) The registration process may vary. The offender should contact the police department prior to arrival for this information.
- 9) There is no fee.
