Good afternoon,

I'm Melissa Marrero with the sex offender unit in Bradford county and I just wanted to answer your request regarding the hurricane/emergency preparedness, so below are our answers.

- (1) Where can registrants evacuate to during a hurricane or natural disaster? **The Bradford County Jail**
- (2) If separate provisions are made for registrants on probation vs. registrants not on probation, what are they? **No different provisions, we do have a back up plan and that would be the Department of corrections for the ones on probation.**
- (3) If specific shelters have been designated for registrants , what is/are the location of those shelters? **The Bradford County Jail 945A N. Temple Ave. Starke, FL 32091.**
- (4) Will registrants be separated from their family if seeking shelter in a designated location? **Yes, Shelters are for registrants only.**
- (5) If an evacuation last 3 or more days such that the evacuation location becomes a "temporary residence" pursuant to F.S. 943.0435, are your registration locations open during the hurricane or natural disaster, to enable a registrant to comply with the in-person registration requirement? **Registration locations will not be open in order to comply the registrant is to contact someone with the Sex Offender Unit.**
