Emergency Evacuation Information

If a disaster strikes, where should you go?

How will you get there?

Do you have a plan?

First, determine your evacuation zone so you know when you're expected to evacuate. Remember, shelters are a last resort. You are strongly encouraged to evacuate to a family member's or a friend's residence during an evacuation situation. If that is not possible, you are required to shelter in an assigned location.

If you need to bring your family, they are required to stay in a separate area of the shelter. You will not be sheltered together during the evacuation.

What You Need To Bring

- Food for 72 hours (non-perishable foods that do not require refrigeration)
- Prescription medication in original containers
- Sleeping bags, pillows, or blankets
- Personal hygiene items
- Important paperwork (insurance policies, property lists, medical information)
- Chargers for cell phones, mobile devices, and any other monitoring device

Important Notes

Alcohol is **not** permitted.

Space is limited at the provided shelter. Make plans for your pet(s) to go to a safe place (family, friend, or boarding facility) if you are required to evacuate.

If you elect to drive your own vehicle to the shelter, you must park in the designated areas. Plan your transportation ahead of time.
